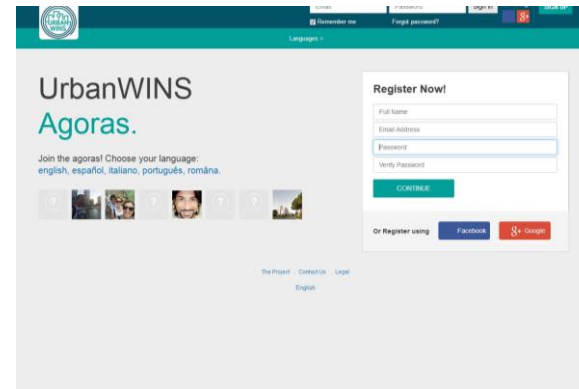
WP'S ENGAGEMENT ACHIEVEMENTS

- ✓ 8 Citizens bloggers are dynamic and operative to discover and share how eco-innovation happens locally
- ✓ More than 572 people attended the physical Agoras of the eight pilot cities: 164 action proposals, corresponding to 34 priorities for waste prevention and management, have been already discussed and analysed
- ✓ The UrbanWINS online agoras users are increasing over time... the participatory process is bringing its results!
- ✓ 2 videos are available on youtube and on UrbanWINS website for the engagement of a wider community

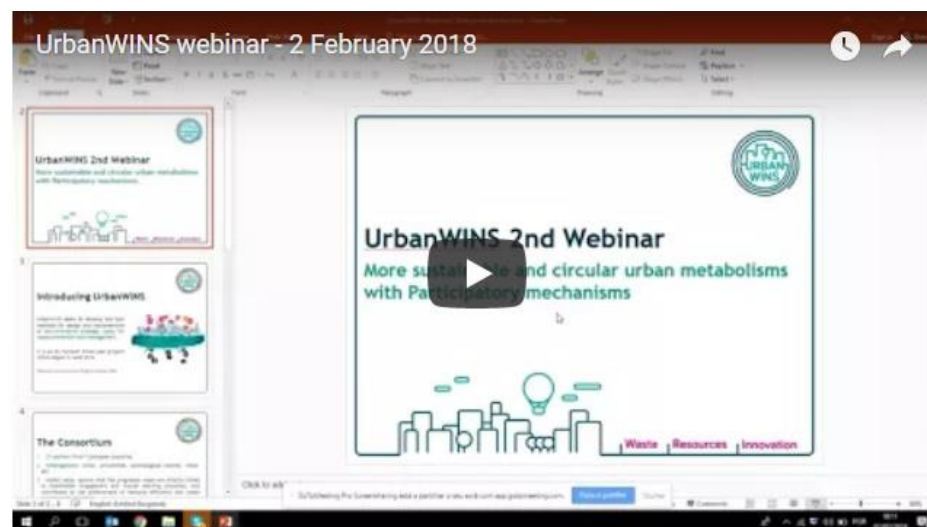
